

#### CONSTITUTION

West Virginia Convention of Southern Baptists

#### ARTICLE I - NAME

This body shall be called West Virginia Convention of Southern Baptists, hereinafter referred to as the Convention.

#### **ARTICLE II - PURPOSE**

The purpose of the Convention is to assist and encourage affiliated churches and associations to fulfill the Great Commission.

#### **ARTICLE III - MEMBERSHIP**

Section 1: This Convention shall consist of messengers who are members of and elected by Southern Baptist churches which are in agreement with the "Baptist Faith and Message 2000," as adopted by the Southern Baptist Convention and which cooperate with, fellowship with, and contribute to the work of the Convention through the Cooperative Program.

Section 2: Each church shall be entitled to three messengers for the first fifty resident members or less and one additional messenger for each fifty resident members or fraction thereof, but in no case shall any church be entitled to more than fifteen messengers. Messengers shall be elected and certified by their churches to the Convention. The Convention office shall provide special registration forms for the churches at least thirty days prior to the annual Convention meeting.

Section 3: Any Baptist church desiring to seat messengers in and thereby become affiliated with this Convention shall make application to the Credentials Committee ninety days prior to the Convention's annual meeting.

Section 4: Any Baptist church that is a chapel or mission of a Baptist church, that constitutes within the year, may make application to the Credentials Committee thirty days prior to the Convention's annual meeting.

Section 5: Watchcare status may be voted by the Convention for a church which does not meet time or other membership requirements. Members of such a church would not be eligible to hold office in the Convention, membership on committees, or vote on Convention matters, but would be eligible to receive all services available to Convention members.

Section 6: A church will be considered a cooperating church:

- 1. Once it has gone through the credentialing process.
- 2. When it has contributed financially through the Convention to the Cooperative Program within the preceding twelve (12) months.

#### **ARTICLE IV - OFFICERS**

Section 1: The officers of the Convention shall be a President, First Vice-President, Second Vice President who shall serve as Assistant Recording Secretary, and Recording Secretary who shall serve as Historian.

Section 2: These officers shall be elected annually upon nomination from the floor. Should more than one person be nominated for the same office, the vote will be by ballot. If a nominee does not receive a majority of the votes cast on the first ballot, a runoff shall be held between the two persons receiving the most votes. Officers

shall be duly installed at the closing session of this Convention and shall hold their respective offices until their successors are elected and installed.

Section 3: No President shall serve more than two consecutive full terms.

Section 4: The President or his designee shall serve as an ex-officio member of every convention committee.

#### ARTICLE V - EXECUTIVE BOARD

Section 1: At its annual meeting this Convention shall elect an Executive Board which shall function for the Convention between annual meetings.

Section 2: The officers of this Convention shall be members of the Executive Board. The Executive Board shall organize itself for its work. If a member of the Executive Board should be elected an officer of the Convention, this election to office shall not affect his term of service on the Executive Board.

Section 3: The Executive Board of this body shall consist of two members from the churches comprising each cooperating association with up to a total church membership of 2,000 and one more for each additional 2,000 church members as reported in the Convention Annual for the preceding year. The total members thus elected shall not exceed five from the churches of any one association. One Executive Board member of each association shall be a layperson, unless one cannot be secured and a pastor may be elected.

Section 4: Each board member must be a member of a cooperating, contributing church within the association in which he or she resides. After serving a three-year term a member shall not be eligible to serve again until a lapse of one year, except that the outgoing President of the WVCSB be asked to serve one additional year on the Executive Board. Election and service to fill an unexpired term of more than eighteen months shall constitute a full term.

Section 5: The Executive Board shall elect all ministry directors and permanent ministry positions, establish policies, propose an annual budget and calendar, and determine the departments and fields of work for the accomplishment of Convention work.

Section 6: An Executive Director-Treasurer shall be elected by the Executive Board. He shall be the administrative officer of the Board and shall make a full report of work committed to it. He shall be bonded.

Section 7: The Executive Board shall make an annual report of its activities and decisions to the Convention during its annual meeting.

Section 8: Executive Board members receiving financial support, or whose family members receive financial support from the North American Mission Board and/or the West Virginia Convention of Southern Baptists, will not be eligible to serve on either the missions or finance committees of the Executive Board.

Section 9: The WMU President shall serve as an ex-officio, member of the Executive Board.

#### **ARTICLE VI - TRUSTEES**

The Convention shall elect trustees. They shall hold in trust all physical properties

of the Convention. After serving a full term of three years, a member shall not be eligible to serve again until a lapse of one year. The senior trustee shall be the chairperson. Trustees shall be bonded as necessary.

#### **ARTICLE VII - MEETINGS**

The Convention shall meet annually at such time and place as may be determined. Special meetings may be called, and time and place of meetings may be changed by the officers of the Convention with the consent of the Executive Board.

#### **ARTICLE VIII - AUTHORITY**

While independent and sovereign in its own sphere, this Convention shall not claim nor exercise any authority over any other Baptist body (church, association, etc.)

#### ARTICLE IX - AMENDMENTS

This Constitution may be altered or amended by the concurrence of two-thirds of the members present at any annual meeting, one year's notice having been given to the proposed alteration or amendment at the Convention.

#### BY-LAWS

#### ARTICLE I - DECORUM OF ANNUAL CONVENTION

- Section 1: The sessions of the Convention shall be opened and closed in prayer.
- Section 2: Persons attending the Convention who are not messengers but who are members of cooperating churches shall have the privilege of speaking in debate, but not voting.
- Section 3: Each person shall address the moderator and be recognized when he speaks in debate or has any communication to make to the Convention.
- Section 4: A person shall not speak more than twice in any single debate on the same day without unanimous permission from the body.
- Section 5: When a person shall be called to order, he shall sit down until the moderator has determined whether he is in order. An appeal may be made from the decision of the moderator in this as in any other case.
- Section 6: When the moderator shall desire to be heard in debate, or to be temporarily absent, the chair shall be taken by one of the officers of the convention or by some messenger whom the moderator may select if no other officer is present.
- Section 7: The Convention president, in conference, with the vice presidents, shall select a parliamentarian and assistant(s), as necessary, to advise the presiding officers of the convention on matters of parliamentary procedure. The selection of a parliamentarian for Executive Board sessions shall be at the discretion of the presiding officer.

#### **ARTICLE II - COMMITTEES**

Section 1: Convention Committees. These committees shall be elected and/or appointed as stated below.

A. Annual Committees. The newly-elected officers of the Convention shall serve as officers of the Executive Board and as a part of the Administrative Committee of the Executive Board. The officers shall annually appoint the following committees in time to have the members' names included in the Convention annual. Annual

Committee members shall serve for three years with one third of the number of committee members being elected each year.

- (1) Order of Business Committee. This committee shall consist of six persons who will work with the Convention officers, staff, and auxiliary organizations to plan and propose the order of business and program for the annual meeting of the Convention. This committee shall report its proposed program to the Executive Board at the September Executive Board Meeting.
- (2) Time, Place, Preacher Committee. This committee shall be composed of three members who shall (a) recommend the preacher and alternate preacher of the Convention for the next annual session; and (b) recommend to the Convention the dates and place for the annual session three years following the Convention in which the recommendation is made.
- (3) Resolutions Committee. This committee shall be composed of six members who shall meet before and/or during the annual session to receive proposed resolutions from messengers, to collate and clarify the resolutions received, and to present the resolutions deemed appropriate in finished form to the Convention for action.
- (4) Committee on Committees. This committee shall consist of six persons who nominate to the Convention in annual session persons to fill vacancies and serve as chairpersons on the Standing Committees.
- B. Standing Committees. These committees shall be elected by the Convention and shall have six members. Committee members shall serve for three years with one third of the number of committee members being elected each year.
- (1) Nominating Committee. This committee shall nominate to the annual session persons to fill vacancies in the West Virginia Baptist Foundation Board of Directors, Convention Executive Board, and Convention Trustees.
- (2) Credentials Committee. This committee shall examine the credentials of churches desiring new affiliation with the Convention and the seating of messengers at the Convention's annual session. After proper examination, the committee shall recommend action to the Convention. This committee shall be responsible to examine qualifications and credentials of messengers whose seats are contested and to recommend action by the Convention.
- (3) Constitution Committee. This committee shall examine the Constitution and Bylaws of the Convention and recommend changes in these documents to the Convention. Questions, proposed changes, or action of the Convention concerning these documents may be referred to this committee which shall then make recommendations for action to the Convention.
- (4) Baptist Scholarship Committee. This committee shall recommend guidelines and application forms for the distribution of scholarship funds. This committee shall select the recipients of the funds.
- (5) Christian Life Committee. It shall be the responsibility of this committee to study moral, social and cultural conditions of society and bring reports and recommendations to the convention as it may deem advisable. It shall report to the convention leadership current matters of public affairs relating to the realm of Christian life. It shall seek to assist churches and associations in educational programs to inform them of moral issues and Christian Citizenship responsibilities.
- C. Special Committees shall be appointed and/or elected as the need arises. They shall have the number of persons deemed necessary and shall serve until their assigned work is completed.
- D. A vacancy in any committee shall be declared by the committee chairman in the event of death, two consecutive unexcused absences, resignation of a committee member, or the committee member becoming a member of a church not affiliated with the convention.

Section 2: Executive Board Committees.

- A. Members of the Executive Board shall serve on ministry-related committees on a rotating basis according to their term of office on the Executive Board. It shall be the responsibility of the ministry-related committees to work with convention ministers to plan, coordinate, and evaluate the ministries and make regular reports to the Executive Board and an annual report to the State Convention. Executive Board members shall be appointed to ministry-related committees by the Administrative Committee. Each committee shall elect its own chairperson.
  - B. The Executive Board will determine the Ministry related committees as needed.
  - C. Administrative Committee
- (1) This committee shall be composed of the four officers of the State Convention, the chairperson of the Finance Committee, and two members at large from the Executive Board and elected by the Executive Board. The Convention President shall serve as chairperson.
  - (2) The responsibilities of this committee shall be:
- a. In the event of a vacancy in the office of the Executive Director-Treasurer, to recommend to the Executive Board a Search Committee of fifteen members who shall be responsible for seeking out and recommending a person for the office of Executive Director-Treasurer of the State Convention. The Search Committee shall be composed of a pastor from each association and other persons as shall give representation to various areas and interests of West Virginia Southern Baptists and shall be knowledgeable of the working of the Executive Board and the State Convention. The Search Committee shall confer with the Administrative Committee to work out details concerned with the calling of a new Executive Director-Treasurer and bring their recommendation to the Executive Board. No more than two persons from the same association shall serve on the Search Committee.
- b. The Administrative Committee shall also be responsible for naming an interim Executive Director-Treasurer until a person is called to that position.
- c. The Administrative Committee, the Executive Director-Treasurer, and the chairperson of the ministry-related committee whose work is involved shall be responsible for seeking out and calling other staff ministers. This committee's recommendation shall be made to the Executive Board of the State Convention.
- d. The Administrative Committee shall present to the State Convention or the Executive Board proposed changes, deletions, and/or additions to the Policies and Procedures Manual when called for by the State Convention or the Executive Board. The Policies and Procedures Manual shall be in keeping with, and not contrary to, the Constitution and Bylaws of the State Convention.
  - D. Program Planning and Budgeting Committee
- (1) This committee shall be composed of the Finance Committee and the chairpersons of the other program related committees.
- (2) Following a preliminary meeting between the state staff and an associational representative to plan a tentative program calendar, this committee shall meet with the state staff for the purpose of developing and presenting to the Convention the following year's program, calendar, and budget.
- E. Finance Committee. In addition to responsibilities which are customary and/or assigned to the Finance Committee, this committee shall work with the Convention Treasurer and Bookkeeper to review the independent auditor's annual report and review monthly financial records of the Convention and to recommend to the Treasurer and Bookkeeper any needed changes in procedure to insure the most beneficial and efficient operation of Convention business. This committee may, at its discretion, seek other assistance as deemed advisable.
- F. Special committees may be elected or appointed as the need arises as determined by the State Convention or the Executive Board.

#### ARTICLE III - EXECUTIVE BOARD

Section 1: A majority of the Board members shall constitute a quorum.

Section 2: Members shall attend all Board meetings unless providentially hindered, and in such cases, notice shall be given to the Board. The Executive Board may declare a Board seat vacant in the event of two consecutive unexcused absences, death of a member, resignation of the member, or the member becoming a member of a church not affiliated with the same district association. In the event a vacancy occurs on the Executive Board between the annual Convention sessions, the Board shall elect a replacement for the unexpired term.

Section 3: The officers of the Convention, together with the chairperson of the Finance committee, and two persons elected at large from the Executive Board, shall serve as the Administrative Committee. The two at large members are nominated or by open nominations from the floor. They shall meet as often as necessary with the State Convention staff to coordinate the work of the Executive Board and its' committees with the work of the State Convention staff.

Section 4: Ordinarily the work of the Executive Board shall be conducted at regularly scheduled meetings. At the discretion of the Administrative Committee, special Executive Board meetings may be called, or items of business, with exception of hiring personnel, may be considered and voted upon through accessible communication resources. During the time period between the close of the Convention and the subsequent Executive Board meeting, the officers of the Convention may, in case of emergency, call a special Executive Board meeting.

Section 5: The Associational Moderators shall be consulted and requested to submit names for consideration for each vacancy to be filled for their Executive Board representative. (Each association, as an autonomous body, if it chooses to do so, may establish its own procedures for selecting names, with these being submitted by the moderator.) This procedure will be used in filling unexpired terms on the Executive Board, as well. More than one nomination per vacancy is requested.

#### ARTICLE IV - WEST VIRGINIA BAPTIST FOUNDATION

The West Virginia Baptist Foundation is a nonprofit corporation of the state of West Virginia. It is the trust arm of the Convention. The Board of Directors of the Foundation is elected by the Convention at its annual meeting.

#### **ARTICLE V - CONTINGENCY RESERVE FUND**

The Executive Director-Treasurer shall keep available for use by the convention in case of emergency a contingency reserve fund equal to three months operating expenses. Should the Executive Board of WVCSB determine by vote that an emergency situation exists; the Executive Board shall be empowered to authorize the use of the Contingency Reserve Fund to mitigate the specific emergency. When said emergency passes, the Reserve Fund will be replenished as quickly as the Executive Board, through its Finance Committee, deems appropriate.

#### **ARTICLE VI - AMENDMENTS**

The foregoing rules may be amended at any annual meeting of the Convention after the amendment has been considered by the Executive Board. A two-thirds vote of messengers present and voting shall be necessary for the adoption of an amendment.

# Report to the Convention 2019

The Foundation has twenty-one separate funds established by individuals, churches, associations, or by the convention. Each fund is invested according to the wishes of the entity which established the fund. The fund's holdings are distributed according to the wishes of the organization which established the fund.

The officers of the Foundation for 2018-2019 are Kyle Neal (President, Immanuel Baptist Church, Mountain State Baptist Association), Matt Smith (Vice-President, Living Hope Baptist Church, Petersburg, Potomac Highland Baptist Association), and Nella Toppings (Secretary, Cross Lanes Baptist Church, Pioneer Baptist Association).

The Snedden-Slaughter Scholarship was awarded to Kyle Neal, attending Southeastern Seminary. A reminder to those applying, all applications for the scholarship must be postmarked by June 1 of each year in order to be considered for the scholarship.

The incorporation papers were filed with the Secretary of State's office. The accounting firm of Herman and Cormany audited the financial transactions and accounting practices of the Foundation and pronounced them to be sound.

We are emphasizing the John I. Snedden-Ray Slaughter Scholarship Fund through 2020. The Snedden Scholarship Fund was started by the Convention in 1979 to honor John Snedden, an important leader in the formation of the West Virginia Convention of Southern Baptists. Snedden served as Association Missionary in the Upper Ohio Valley Association and also as the Executive Director of the West Virginia convention in the years it was forming. At the 2010 state convention, the messengers approved combining the Ray Slaughter Scholarship Fund with the Snedden Fund. This was done with the prior approval and recommendation of the Immanuel Baptist Association, which had started the Slaughter Fund for the same purpose many years ago, to honor the devoted ministry by Ray Slaughter on behalf of the churches. Ray Slaughter was a tireless worker for and minister to the churches.

The interest from the fund goes to selected students who are in college or seminary and preparing for a church vocation. The fund has approximately \$17,700 in it now.

We encourage individuals, churches, Sunday School classes, and other groups to give to the fund.

## **WVCSB 2019 REPORTS**

#### CLEDITH CAMPBELL, INTERIM EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

I'm grateful for the opportunity to serve this great convention as the Interim Executive Director. These past months have been both challenging and exciting.

We began a Monday morning prayer time where the entire staff meets for a time of devotion and prayer before we kick off our work week. We pray for each other, our churches and their pastors, and for our search committee, specifically that God will bring the right person to us to lead our convention forward.

In order to make our building more secure we have changed the pass codes to the entry door and reassigned new codes to each person. This will allow us to know when a person is in the building as well as knowing who has a pass code to the building.

I've been in conversations with leadership at the North American Mission Board (NAMB) concerning funding for our convention. Funding for 2020 will remain the same for the first three quarters, but will change to a new funding plan the fourth quarter of 2020. This new funding plan could cut the funds we are receiving from NAMB by as much as \$172,220. Dallas Smith, WVCSB finance chairman, is aware of these cuts and his committee has worked hard to make the necessary changes in our proposed 2020 budget. The full impact of these new cuts will be felt in 2021, but because of the hard work and foresight of our finance committee, we are well prepared to handle these challenges.

Related to this new budget news, I had a conference call with all of our associational directors of missions and explained to them that we need their help in obtaining three important pieces of information from 2017-2018. We need the churches that have not reported their ACP's to provide the total number of baptisms for those two years as well as their total membership numbers and their average Sunday Morning worship attendance. These figures are important in adjusting our future funding from NAMB.

Finally, our Credentials Committee will be recommending to our convention that New Vision Baptist Church of Berkeley Springs, West Virginia be admitted to our state convention.

In closing I am happy to report to you that during the first six months of this year our WVCSB churches gave \$697,355.27 to mission work outside of West Virginia broken down as follows:

- \$281,921.97 through the Cooperative Program
- \$248,759.81 to Lottie Moon
- \$6,475.08 to IMB World Hunger
- \$158,579.64 to Annie Armstrong
- \$1,618.77 to NAMB World Hunger

To this I would simply say, "To God be the glory, great things he hath done."

#### TIM TURNER, EVANGELISM + DISCIPLESHIP

2019 has been a fantastic year. October 1 marked my three year anniversary of coming to the great state of West Virginia to serve the WVCSB. It has been a year of constant travel, but I am grateful for the invitations by WVCSB churches and associations who grant me a place in their pulpits. It is always a joy to meet new people, preach and teach the Word, and share Jesus' name. In reality, I am living my younger man's dream. By the way, I am also going to be a grandfather! YES!

I can say joyfully these past three years have been an incredible learning experience and that pastors have probably encouraged me more than I have them. Not a lot is said about our pioneer state, but I have personally seen and heard the stories of changed lives in so many communities. I have worshipped at Sunday gatherings, Wednesday night prayer meetings, and Saturday night events at which God has poured out his blessing! I have shared with churches in Sunday school and discipleship training events, retreats, evangelism conferences, and have seen the results of dozens of churches that understand the importance of VBS. There is no denying the movement of God here in West Virginia.

I am also encouraged by what is transpiring on college campuses. I have attended student worship services and met with campus ministers to listen how God has led and moved in mighty ways. That's *never* a waste of time to hear those reports! The WVCSB will also be adding an additional campus minister at WVU Tech in 2020.

This past year, one of our main goals was to continue to introduce the 3 Circles initiative offered by the North American Mission Board (NAMB). I have spoken with churches that have taught it in discipleship settings. Many of those congregations have seen fruit from those gospel conversations. To support that effort, the Who's Your One initiative introduced at the Southern Baptist Convention has propelled the evangelism thrust even more. God is working.

As during every year, I was also highly involved in planning or implementation of the following in 2019:

- January 10-12, VBS Institute at Ridgecrest (state leadership team)
- February 15-16, State VBS Training (17 churches)
- March 1-2, Youth Evangelism Conference (585 attendees, 20 decisions)
- April 6, Sexual Abuse Awareness Training
- September 13-14, Men and Boys Retreat
- October 3, INSPIRE Evangelism Conference

This coming year I will continue to offer my help with churches in any way that I can by preaching, teaching, or training in any needed areas in our churches.

#### DANNY RUMPLE, CHURCH PLANTING + MISSIONS

As 2019 closes and as 2020 approaches, I am reminded that the WVCSB will soon celebrate its fiftieth anniversary as a convention of churches. It is an awesome thing to be able to celebrate 50 years of cooperative partnership between churches for the glory of God and obedience to the Great Commission. Many things keep us busy in ministry, but none should be more important than cooperative mission between churches. It's the cornerstone of Southern Baptist life.

During this past year, we continued to see strategic church planting move forward in our state with these two core values:

- 1. Churches plant churches.
- 2. New churches are started through evangelism and discipleship, men and women engaged, communities on mission to see God's kingdom come.

New works in places such as Charleston and Hagerstown have not only been birthed, but they were birthed through strong local church sending and support. God is raising up the next wave of missionary pastors to go and make disciples in and through West Virginia.

Through our great partnership with the North American Mission Board (NAMB), and because of their generous support, we were able to host Vance Pitman this spring for our Sent Workshop. Pastors and leaders from around our state learned how to have a kingdom focus in ministry (both here and abroad), how to engage in strategic recovery ministries, as well as how to build a leadership pipeline in the local church.

We are seeing God do amazing things in West Virginia, and yet, we face many challenges. As encouraging as it is to see a number of churches engaged in missions and church planting around our state, that number is still a small minority. We will work tirelessly to see more churches involved in this mission in 2020. Continued Leadership Pipeline training will be made available to help our pastors learn how to better discover, develop, and deploy leaders in their churches that God might be calling to go out and be on mission through church planting.

West Virginia Southern Baptists have a great opportunity to do ministry in a state that desperately needs the good news of Jesus Christ. Drug addiction, unemployment, broken homes, and poverty are the problems we see daily and, as Christians, we must work to help alleviate these. However, there is also an unseen spiritual world that we must resolutely decide to engage. This is our calling as followers of Jesus. "Therefore, we are ambassadors for Christ, God making his appeal through us. We implore you on behalf of Christ, be reconciled to God. For our sake he made him to be sin who knew no sin, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God" (2 Corinthians 5:20-21).

#### CLEVE PERSINGER, COMMUNICATION + PARTNERSHIPS

God is doing great things in West Virginia! However, we cannot be satisfied with where we are when there are so many lost people living among us. During this period between Dr. Bill Henard transitioning back to the pastorate and hiring a new executive director-treasurer, the WVCSB directors are committed to staying heads down and working diligently to set up the new state executive and our convention for success in the unique opportunities that God is calling us to.

#### STRENGTHEN CHURCHES WITH EXCELLENCE

A large part of my role and ministry area serves all of the ministries of the WVCSB by seeking to create excellent, effective, creative, and professional communication strategies and experiences that strengthen and send churches to make Jesus known in and through West Virginia. A variety of communications vehicles accomplish this goal throughout the year such as print, online, digital, video, social media, and events.

We've worked hard to implement a culture of excellence while producing WVCSB events. This was evident in 2019 with a nationally known speaker lineup that welcomed Jason Gaston (YEC), Vance Pitman (Sent Workshop), Mark Dance (Shepherding the Shepherd), Mark Clifton (INSPIRE), and Johnny Hunt (annual meeting). More quality events and speakers are slated for 2020, our convention's fiftieth anniversary, including SBC entity heads Kevin Ezell and Paul Chitwood. Because of faithful Cooperative Program giving by WVCSB churches, we are able to keep these gatherings and resources at no to low cost.

Throughout 2019, we continued development work on a redesign of the convention's website, wvcsb.org. The launch of the site is anticipated for spring 2020.

#### ACCELERATE GOSPEL IMPACT

We recognize for the many WVCSB churches that are successfully making a gospel impact in their communities, between other states, and globally, there are however, churches who are just struggling to keep their doors open, let alone actively seeking mission partners for gospel impact. We want to help you look for how God is at work, and celebrate as a church how you can join in the mission of God to advance the gospel no matter your size or weekly attendance.

A while back we began the process of identifying existing partnerships in our churches, but wish to do so much more as a convention in 2020 to highlight and pour fuel on the fire in order to see a movement of God flow out of West Virginia as churches take their next steps to collectively make Jesus known.

Our state office exists to serve you - in fact, 18,000 miles were compiled this year on my vehicle alone! Please let us know how we can walk alongside and help your church multiply through one-on-one consulting, training, ministry connections, and more.
