This model guides individuals in a healing group to address spiritual and emotional wounds caused by trauma of violence, abuse, disasters, addiction, divorce, and more. This equipping session is for lay people, pastors, mental health professionals, NGO workers, and those who are already ministering to people who have high levels of trauma. The American Bible Society and the Trauma Healing Institute equips and supports a world-wide community of workers in trauma care.
