-★ CRUISE RULES

- **1.** Wear closed toe shoes (Crocs OK) at all times except at pool, slip-n-slide, and cabins.

- **6.** Cell phones can be used during approved times in cabins but are not allowed in the worship gatherings except on Friday morning for group photos, etc.
- **7.** DRESS MODESTLY: No short shorts and skirts (finger tip length test), no tight clothing that reveals undergarments, no spaghetti straps, no speedos or midriff-baring bathing suits (two-pieces can be covered with a t-shirt), no clothing with questionable sayings or alcohol/tobacco advertising.
- **8**. Ask a counselor to accompany you when special needs arise physical, mental, spiritual.
- **9.** Believe the best in others. No fighting, cursing, name calling, or bullying. Treat others with respect.

PRAY - Talk to God:

"Jesus, this week I've seen how easily I chase after things that promise identity but always leave me empty. But you gave your life to make me new. You died in my place, rose from the grave, and now call me your own. I'm not who the world says I am. I'm not who my past says I am. I am who you say I am—fully known, fully loved, and fully yours. Help me live like I believe Jesus + nothing = everything. I don't need a platform, approval, comfort, or image to chase anymore. I have you—and you're enough."

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
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
